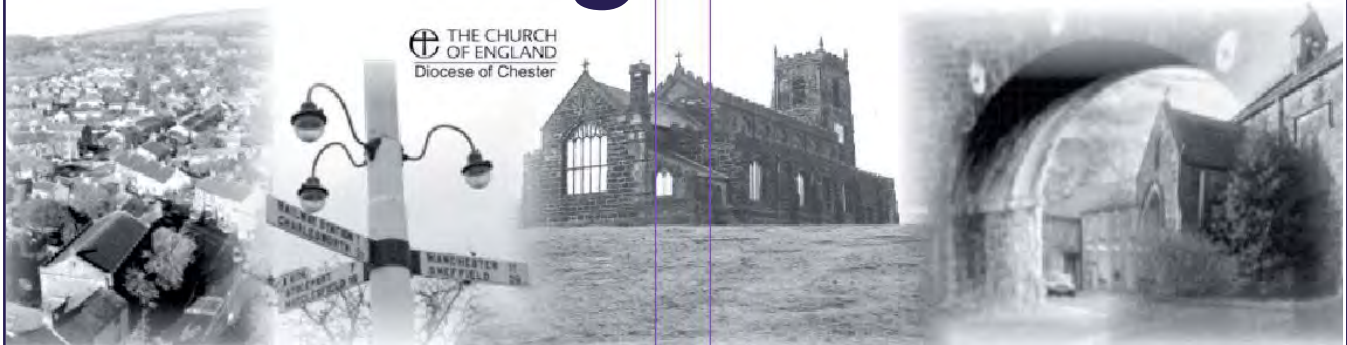

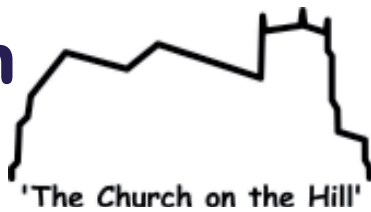

Mrs Bland Writes



Trust in God...

As the privileged Headteacher of Mottram and Broadbottom CofE Primary schools, I've been known as many things and even been given the odd nickname (not all repeatable!). Some of the list I can only agree with: giddy? Yes. Hyper? Definitely. Loving? I hope so. Gorgeous? I really hope so!

Others are a little more controversial: impatient? Probably. Crazy? Only when necessary. A control freak? I completely denied it at the time, but on reflection... What has my life as a Christian leader taught me? Enough to write a book, but I'll try to stick to these things.

Patience. Well, I know I have none. I now realise Broadbottom, Mottram and, yes, Rome were not built in a day. In fact I'm still building in both schools (as well as my own house) 15 years later. St Paul reminds us that patience (or 'patient endurance') produces character, and that character increases our hope in God (Romans 5).

As for 'crazy'. I like to embrace the word as a compliment - who wants to be normal?! Life is crazy, our world is crazy and life as a Headteacher and single mum is certainly crazy, so I fit in perfectly! What I've come to learn is that God loves me, crazy or not. Again and again the Bible speaks of God's love. St John writes: "How great is the love

that God has lavished upon us, that we should be called children of God - and that is what we are!" (1John 3:1) - we love our children with all their brilliance and imperfections, and it's wonderful to know God feels the same (in fact, more) about us.

What about 'control freak'? When someone first said it, I didn't like it at all. It was probably true - and to some extent still is. As the Headteacher of 2 schools, it's probably a good attribute to look in control, be in control and show control. But what I have I learned? I think it's fair to say my life and career have not always followed the smoothest path and it's at these times that many feel out of control, lost in a downward spiral. Which is why it's been so important for me to be sure in my faith and trust in God - the only one who is truly in control. "Trust in God" is peppered all through the Bible and remains my favourite piece of advice. Trusting him through the good times and bad, Christians can relax a little and realise that God always does what is right. Through our prayers and faith he guides us both now and for the future.

Faith, hope and love - the things we long for to define the lives of the children at both our parish schools.

Emergency Bellframe Repairs

You may have noticed during April, that the bells stopped ringing, and the clock stopped! The problem was that the bellframe needed some emergency repairs. Two new steel beams were fitted directly underneath the bellframe by TLB Services from Newark. We're pleased to report that the bells can now be rung, although on Sundays and weddings only for now.

We have a long term plan for a complete renovation, including replacement of the other rusting steelwork. This will form a large part of the HLF grant that we are applying for later this year.

LOVE IN ACTION

NEWS FROM THE FOODBANK

During the first 3 months of this year, we provided 148 food parcels which fed 211 adults and 170 children. Thank you to all of you, and to Tesco, who gave us 212kg of food that would otherwise go to waste.

Counselling services

We have been working hard on our new counselling services. Five volunteers have completed a course on an Introduction to Welfare Benefits. We have two computers donated by Martin Lewis of Money Saving Expert and can now offer:

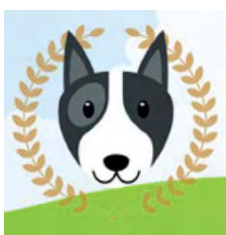
- Computers, internet access, printing and scanning for clients to claim Universal Credit, check their benefits entitlement and job search
- Volunteers who can help clients with benefits entitlement, budgeting and application for grants

A few brave and patient clients have tried out the service and found it useful.

How you can help

- Friday 6th and Saturday 7th July, 9am-5pm. Food collection at Tesco Extra Hattersley. Please let us know if you can help out for a couple of hours.
- Set up a standing order to the foodbank. Local people give almost £16,500 of food each year but we also need money. For example £10 a month would help with rent, admin, phone etc.

This really blessed me when I read it recently...

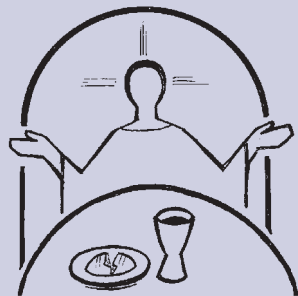
Our Great High Priest

At the time Jesus lived on earth there were priests ministering in the Temple in Jerusalem. They wore special clothes made of linen.

Ordinary priests had four garments, but the High Priest had eight, four of which were called 'golden vestments' because they had gold worked into them, gold being the symbol of splendour. They all had a girdle or sash, which was probably the most distinctive priestly vestment because it was put on during actual ministration and put off immediately afterwards.

In Revelation 1.13 Jesus is seen in the midst of the candlesticks (representing churches), with a golden girdle around his chest. We may understand by this that our great High Priest is engaged in actual ministry to us. His love and peace are ever and always shed upon his people.

May our eyes and hearts and minds be always open to see and to receive and to live in his love and peace.

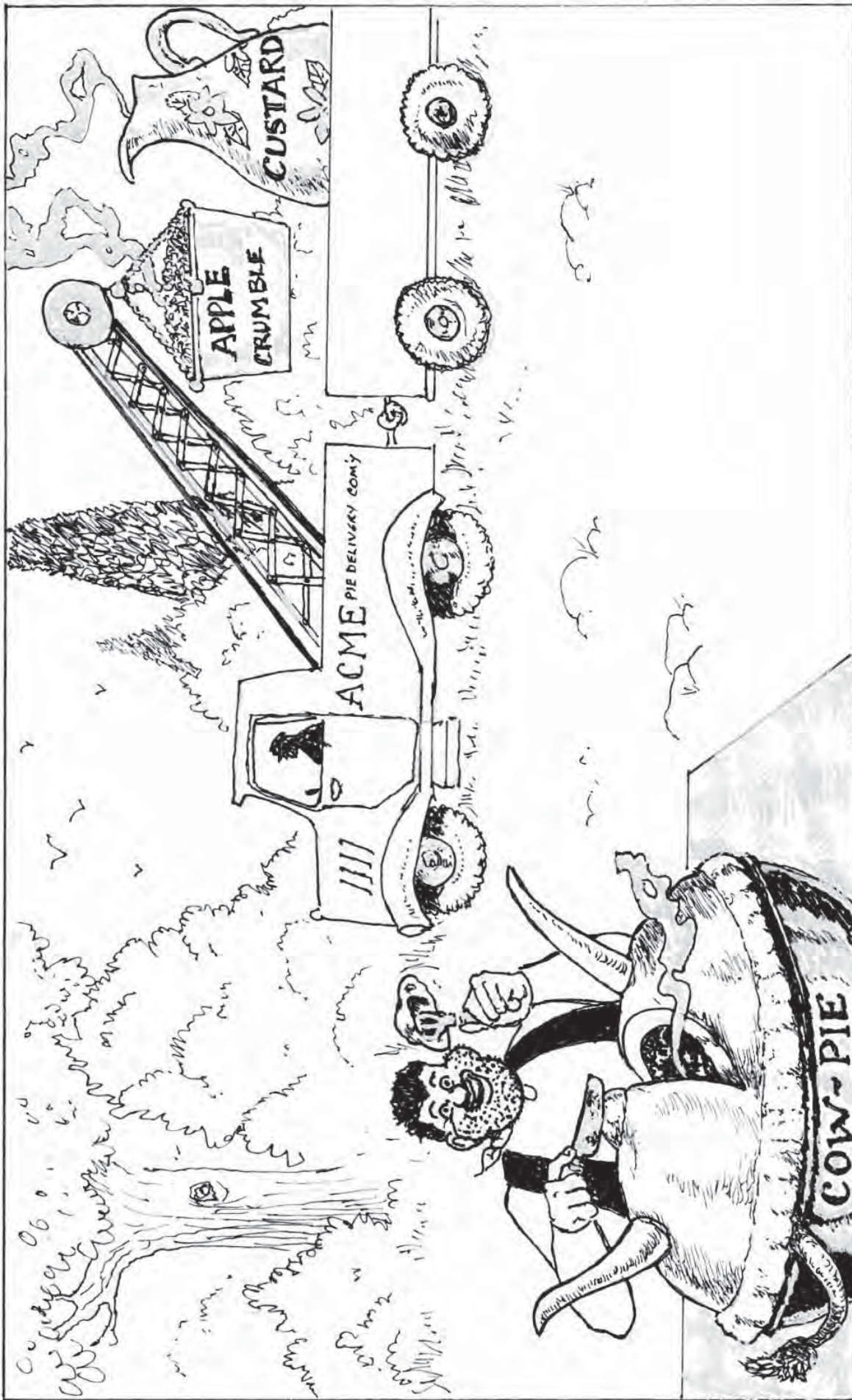

THE WORD

World Cup Fever

Paul Hardingham looks forward to the world cup...

The former Liverpool Manager Bill Shankly famously said, *'Some people believe football is a matter of life and death, I am very disappointed with that attitude. I can assure you it is much, much more important than that!'*

This month sees the start of the World Cup in Russia; a truly global event watched by billions on television. Yet this competition illustrates some key points about the Christian life. As St. Paul writes:

'But one thing I do: forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus.' (Philippians 3:13b,14).

A prize to be won: The dream of every player in the competition is to be able to hold up the World Cup themselves. For us the prize is the eternal life, God's gift of relationship

with him for now and eternity through Jesus. But there's an important difference between football and the Christian faith. To win the World Cup you have to be good enough, while Christ's love for us is undeserved and is not dependent on how well we've done.

Training to be undertaken: If a team is going to win the World Cup, they have to train hard beforehand. Our training, as Christians, starts the moment we accept the gift of God's life. On a daily basis, we train ourselves to say no to the wrong things in our lives. As we build up our godly muscles we are better able to choose to do what is right in God's eyes. To enable us to do all this we need to engage in the spiritual disciplines of prayer, studying the Bible and being part of a church and small group. How is your training going?

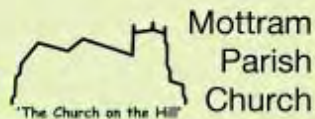
