



Advent by Rev. Cait Walker

"Are you nearly ready for Christmas?" I truly believe that this phrase rears its head earlier and earlier each year.

It made me wonder what it means to be 'ready' for Christmas? I remember my mum saying we couldn't put the



decorations up until the house was tidy, which I totally understand but still wonder if it was her ploy to make me tidy up.

Let's make a list (don't forget to check it twice):

- * have you made enough food? You never know who might turn up last minute.
- * Have you put enough lights up? Remember how bad it looked last year when the neighbours lit every brick on the front of their house and you put a bedraggled wreath on the door on Dec 25th?
- Have you forgotten anyone from your card list or present list? (You know someone will turn up on Christmas Eve with a gift and you have completely forgotten them)
- Don't forget the dog, the neighbour's budgie and to feed the wild birds.

These are the sorts of messages we get bombarded with every time we enter a shop. Is it any wonder that stress levels rise excessively over this period of the year?

Let us take a moment to look at this time. We are now in Advent; a time of waiting and yes, preparing for the light of the world to come. Many Christians choose not to put up their decorations until Christmas Eve because that is when the festival begins, and then they take them down at the end of Epiphany. (continued overleaf)

I have to admit, I probably couldn't wait that long, but could I spend some time in quiet contemplation, over the next weeks, of what it means to prepare for Jesus entering, anew, our lives and our hearts at this time? Could I think about the privilege it is to be able to celebrate in the way that I do? What have so many given to enable this to happen? You may like to think about those who work tirelessly to provide food, entertainment, warmth and comfort for you. Or you might not feel terribly warm, comfortable or included in the merriment. Non-the-less, the light came into the world for each of us, regardless of how merry our Christmases may feel. Jesus entered the world by the Holy Spirit and the love and care of a young woman, who also gave so much for this to happen. People from all walks of life recognized Him as the light.

How will you prepare for that light? The season of merriment may be too much for you this year, but we all have an opportunity to invite *the* light into our lives, hearts, homes and workplaces. That opportunity is a gift; a gift from God, which is so important that it renews itself in our lives over and over again. We, as the body of Christ, share this light, pass it from one to another and watch as its radiance spreads. The image of light spreading from Christingle to Christingle, gently lifting the gloom of a church on a December afternoon, draws to mind. We can open our hearts to God's light and pass this gift on through prayer for one another, kindness and gentleness to ourselves and to others. We can watch this precious light grow in us and in our community. Let us pray that we don't miss this gift amongst the wrappings of Christmas.

May God bless you this Advent season and, when it arrives, I wish you all a very Happy Christmas.





Inspection of a good school: Mottram C of E Primary School

The new school year had just begun when the phone call came:-

"Ofsted Inspection tomorrow".

At the last inspection in July 2017 the school was classed as "good" but so much has changed in the world since then! The Inspectors spent a day in school talking to pupils, staff, parents and governors about life at Mottram School. They identified a happy, family-orientated school where all pupils are nurtured and cared for and where older pupils look after younger ones. All staff have high expectations of what pupils should achieve and how they should behave. As those of you lucky enough to have visited the school have seen, pupils are polite and respectful to each other and to adults.

As well as in-depth "dives" into early reading, art and design and maths, the inspectors looked at everything that makes up a school, from archery to residential trips to growing vegetables on the school allotment. It was heartwarming to read that "pupils enjoy coming to school. Their attendance is high. Pupils follow clear routines. This helps to maintain a calm environment during lessons so that pupils can learn without disruption"

and "staff love working in the school and feel valued and respected".

After a very full and exhausting day we awaited the report with quiet confidence and were delighted with the outcome

"Mottram C of E Primary School continues to be a good school."

Well done! An excellent result for all to be proud of.


