

Churchyard Memorial Garden Burial of cremated remains

Eligibility

The right of burial of cremated remains in the Memorial Garden is open to all Parishioners and to those whose names were entered on the Parish Electoral Roll at the time of death, whether Parishioners or not. The Vicar has sole discretion in other cases.

Interment

Interment of ashes may be done in one of two ways:

- ❖ Burial of ashes (**without urns or other vessels**) directly into the soil in an unmarked spot.
- ❖ Burial of ashes (**without urns or other vessels**) directly into the soil in a particular plot, with a memorial tablet (*provided by the applicant*).

Ashes are placed directly into the soil without a container so that they become part of the living garden

Ashes cannot be 'scattered' under any circumstances.

The Interment ceremony consists of a few brief prayers in the Memorial Garden.

Memorial Tablets at Marked Plot

Memorial tablets - must be provided by applicant and conform to the standard size and design already in practice in the Memorial Garden and cemented adjacent to the burial plot

Garden Maintenance

The Memorial Garden is a place of simple beauty where every season is a reminder of nature's gifts. The Garden is maintained by the Church as a serene place for prayer and contemplation by all persons.

To assist us in maintaining the appearance and feel of the Memorial Garden we have strict regulations concerning what may/may not be placed on grave plots. This is because we're keen to keep the area very natural, as much as it is to prevent loss/damage

The following are not permitted within the garden

- Rose trees, bushes, large or tall plants
- Loose pebbles, gravel or stones
- Ornaments, decorations or lights
- Wreaths, cut or artificial flowers
- Glass, ceramic and/or resin containers or objects i.e. vases, jars (in order to safely maintain grounds)

Desired

Ground covering plants i.e. Heathers are preferred as they are low growing, suitable for the hill top, maintenance free and minimise weed growth. They are also colourful

Permitted

Low growing plants or flowers, e.g. primulas, snowdrops, crocuses, pansies which are actually growing living plants.

Preferred foliage has been chosen for beauty in accordance with a natural setting and design of the garden.

The beauty and serenity of Memorial Gardens can only be sustained through proper maintenance. Adherence to the floral regulations better enables the attainment of that goal.

The Church Council will monitor the situation regularly, and will remove forbidden items without notice. The Church Council also reserves the right to prune, cut down or remove any shrub, plant or flowers which in their opinion have become unsightly, overgrown or dangerous.

Cut flowers may be placed by the Book of Remembrance inside the Church, by arrangement.

Book of Remembrance

In Mottram Parish Church we have a Book of Remembrance, containing names of those who have died. The book is arranged in months, usually open at the current month, but available for inspection for other months on request. Entries are necessarily brief: full name, date of birth and death, age at death, plus a very brief epitaph (see examples below).

Into your hands I commit my spirit (Psalm 31.5)

O give thanks to the Lord for he is good (Psalm 118.1)

Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8.39)

Death is swallowed up in victory (I Corinthians 15.54)

He who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus (II Corinthians 4.14)
