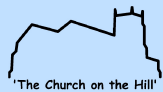

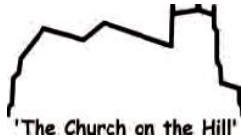

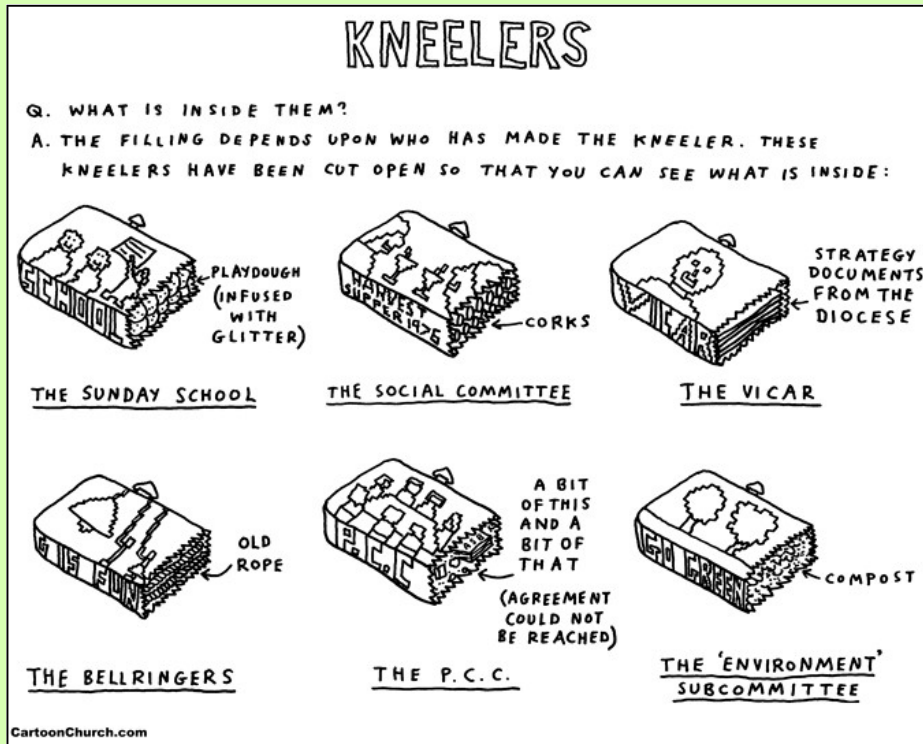

Rev. Adele Writes



"Forget the former things;
do not dwell on the past.
See, I am doing a new thing!
Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?
I am making a way in the wilderness
and streams in the wasteland.

ISA 43:18-19

On a trip to Rwanda some 10 years ago, I got a peek into what it would be like there without water. Neighbouring Uganda experiences droughts regularly now; the parched ground and trees and crops crying out for life, the grass looking more brown and red than green.

It's hard for us in Mottram, sitting on top of this hill at the foot of the Pennines, to imagine that. We are more likely to have too much rain than not enough. Although some years we might get the odd hose pipe ban, most of us have never seen an arid desert. So perhaps we lose some of the impact of this passage. It is a picture of life.

A river winds and twists and turns. It is alive and it brings life to the barren edges of the desert and dry ground as it touches them so that new life may grow.

To have a living relationship with the living God is to follow His river. The course He sets. And to be renewed in relationship with Jesus Christ. To measure our faith not by what we do and how we do it but by our Christ-likeness. Are we closer to Jesus today than we were 2 years ago? To remain static is to die but to keep following Jesus is to remain alive and bring life to others.

Jesus is alive and His life brings life to us. We can place the heavy burdens we carry on His shoulders and in turn receive His grace, joy and freedom of living with and for Him.

The Church of England was one of the twenty-two founder members of *Churches Together in England* in 1990. There are now fifty-three member churches.

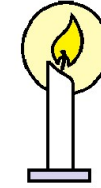

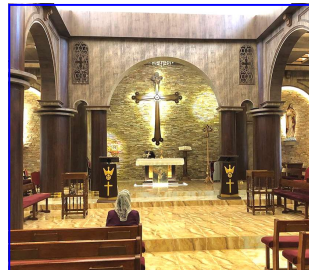

God in the Sciences

The Love of Wisdom of Natural Things

Some time ago a scientist was invited to speak at the Dewsbury Women's Institute. He spoke about his research on polymers, hoping that the women of this Yorkshire mill town would be interested in the new fibres.



One person in particular, a woman called Betty who had worked in a mill since the age of 15, listened as if her life depended on it, and peppered him with questions afterwards. She had always been interested in how things work, but until that day had not found anyone to answer her questions. Whenever she had asked about the processes in the mill, she was just told to get on with her job.

Science can seem like a closed speciality, hemmed in by intimidating jargon. When McLeish described science as 'the love of wisdom of natural things', however, he realised he was opening a door. He was moved to see that Betty was not the only person who shed a tear when her questions were finally taken seriously; confirming that her enquiring mind was indeed probing in the right direction – only 50 years too late.

McLeish is convinced that there is a future in 'science therapy'. In his book *Faith and Wisdom in Science*, where this story appears, he asks the question "If the activity of representing both inner and outer worlds in paint, music and drama can help to heal minds, what hope might there be for a participation in gentle and contemplative science in restoring a broken or misunderstood relationship with the physical world?"

This story inspired me to run a number of science activities with adult audiences in churches. I have extracted DNA from strawberries with a midweek group for older people, organised hands-on activities, and even had groups extracting DNA from their own cheek cells.

When I lead activities like these, I find that grown-ups are grateful for the opportunity to have a go at science themselves. Science is not just for children and professionals – it is for everyone to enjoy and explore the world God has made.

24th February- International War Animal Day

No doubt many of you will have seen purple poppies on Remembrance Day, amongst the majority of red ones. These poppies are in remembrance of animals who sacrificed their lives in World War 1, "they had no choice" and the animals who continue to do so in more recent conflicts.

There are many famous tales of animals in WW1 – Simpson's donkey who carried many wounded from the battlefields and Warrior, on whom Michael Morpurgo based War Horse. What is not well known is that over half a million horses, donkeys and mules served in WW1 carrying troops, water, guns and supplies.

Purple poppy badges are sold throughout the year by the War Horse Memorial Organisation, the money raised going to charities whose aim it is to improve animal welfare through direct funding or education.

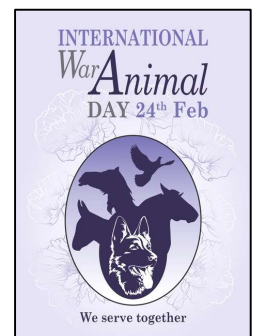
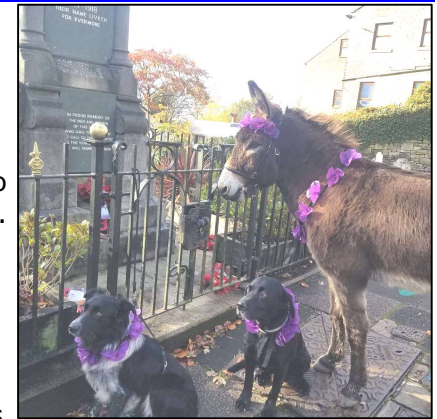
I was asked to lay a purple poppy wreath at Broadbottom War Memorial last year, along with Colin the donkey, known to many from the church Nativity (a morning we both enjoy). I found the experience extremely moving, Colin sensed the importance of the occasion and I had tears in my eyes.

In 2018, a group of ladies in Richmond, North Yorkshire, crocheted purple poppies which were displayed in a local pet shop. They were later mounted on a camouflage net from Catterick Garrison and donated to the Northern Region of the Donkey Breed Society. These, along with knitted models of horses, donkeys, mules and soldiers alongside other artefacts have been on loan to Northern Military Museums.

The display is now back in Richmond. The purple poppies have pride of place at the Green Howards military Museum in a special exhibition; 'Animal Allies', set to run from February to December.

The Northern region of the Donkey Breed Society is at present raising funds for a statue of a donkey to be part of a memorial to animals in WW1. It will be located at Pozières in the Somme region of France.

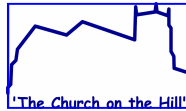

A NOTICE FROM G/M POLICE



Dear Residents,

Your Local Neighbourhood Policing Team are currently working to address the issue of Off Road Motorbikes and Quad bikes being used illegally by youths and adults within the Greater Manchester Area, causing a significant impact on local residents.

Officers across Greater Manchester have been handed a new device that will help them identify anti-social behaviour offenders.

The device, which will come into force immediately, will support officers who are dealing with anti-social behaviour on motorbikes, e-bikes and quadbikes.

SmartTag, a special, traceable forensic spray developed by DeterTeck UK, allows our officers to 'tag' an offender and their bike with a water-based marking solution. The solution has a unique forensic code relating to the pressurised cannister it was sprayed from, which will help to link a suspect and vehicle to the scene of the offence.

This will be done by officers using a UV light to scan the offender's clothing and bike which will highlight the bright yellow solution to show that they have been tagged.

"This device will hopefully act as a deterrent to those participating in anti-social and criminal behaviour with the aid of motorbikes, e-bikes and quadbikes. They now know that they will be sprayed with a solution that will link them back to the scene of the crime."

Our aim is to get the message across to the public that we are doing something about this issue."

SmartWater has a 100 per cent conviction rate in contested Court cases.

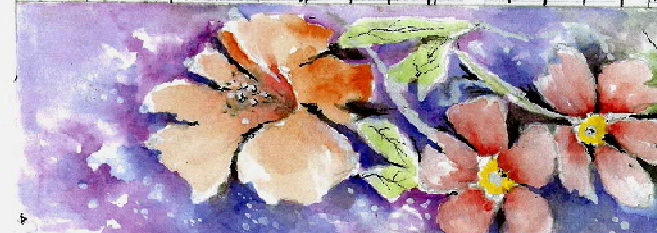

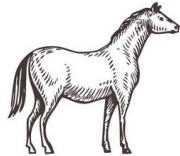

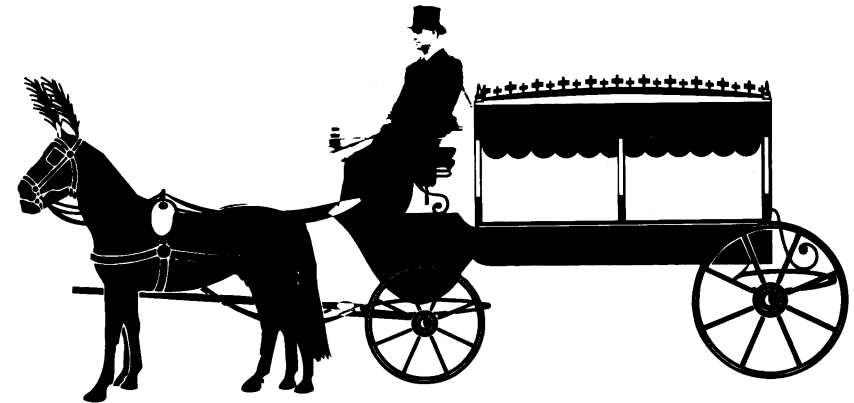
