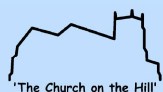

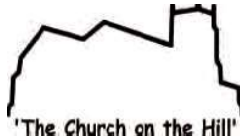

Happy New Year



Rev. Adele Writes



Over Christmas a favourite pastime is looking at lights around the village. I love how bright they can make a dark night. In my study at Christmas, I've had light curtain snowflakes at the windows and it made me smile each time I looked up from my desk. In fact, I enjoyed them so much I've invested in some less festive curtain lights with butterflies on to replace them! The decorations and lights start to come down in January – if you're like me, on New Year's Day. And the village looks dark again until spring brings lighter evenings. But there is another festival right on our doorsteps.

We had a fantastic Christingle service on Christmas Eve - celebrating Jesus, the light of the world. Did you know that some places don't do Christingle until Epiphany (Jan 6th) as this is the time when we remember the 3 wise men following a star to worship Jesus. The wise men are late-comers to the nativity scene as they travelled the furthest. They were outsiders, not part of God's people – The Jewish people. But an old promise said that God's people would be a light to the whole world. And here at Epiphany we see some wise men, from the east, coming looking for light in the darkness; the light of Christ.

I've often wondered, what if the wise men had thought; 'Nah this Jesus isn't for us, we're not part of that bunch of weird people who worship on War Hill!', or 'What if they think we're weird because we dress different,' or 'What if Jesus doesn't like what we bring him as gifts,' or 'Do we really have time to be travelling that far to see some child we can't be sure is even going to save us.' Thankfully they didn't think any of those things and these outsiders became a part of the nativity we treasure today. They sought Jesus out and were included!

So in the cold and dark of January, after we've eaten too much, spent up and taken down the decorations - there is still light. Maybe the reason Epiphany is in January is because wise men (and women and kids) still seek Jesus in January too.

I pray you have a happy and blessed New Year. *Rev. Adele*

Betty Gadd, affectionately known to so many of us as Auntie Betty, died in the early hours of Sunday 15 December, aged 91.

As Rev. Adele said, Betty was a tiny person who has left a huge hole in the congregation.

Betty ran a prayer group which originally met at her house. Undeterred by Covid and Lockdown she continued (assisted by Tony) with a virtual online prayer group focussing on people's particular requests. It was a great help and comfort to many.

She also organised and ran the church library, which will soon be available again now that the books no longer need to be shut away from the damp.

She was a faithful member of the choir for very many years and was singing in her usual place a few days before she died.

Betty made many contributions to the Parish Magazine.

Not long ago she gave us this poem by E.W. Wilcox.

It seemed perfect for Sea Sunday but Betty looked thoughtful and said it was more usually read at funerals.

It seems sadly appropriate now.

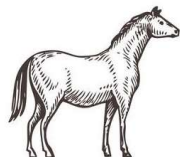

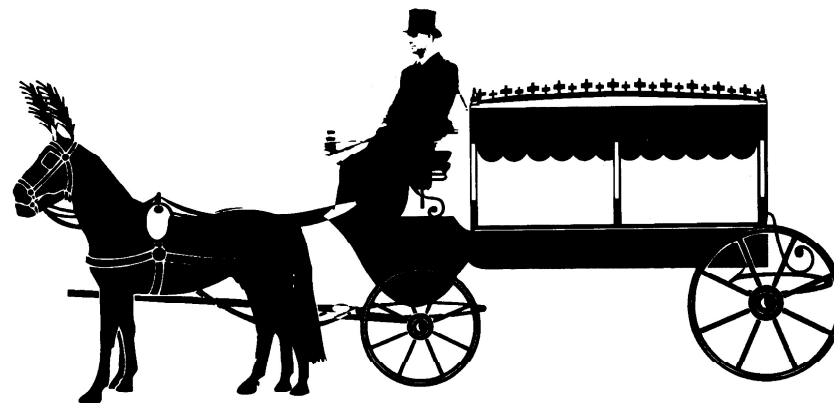
