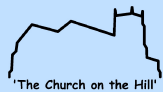

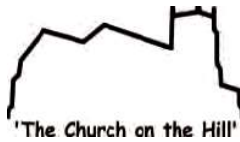

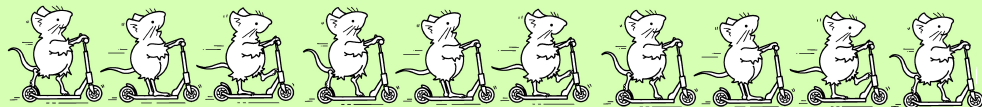

COVER PICTURE

What Our Lord Saw from the Cross

'*Ce que voyait Notre-Seigneur sur la Croix*' was painted about 1890 by the French artist James Tissot (1836 -1902). The work is highly unusual for its portrayal of the Crucifixion of Jesus from the perspective of Jesus on the cross. The scene shows witnesses including Jesus' followers, participants and bystanders; of Jesus' own body only the feet can be seen, at the bottom of the picture.

In 1882 James Tissot had returned to Paris following an 11-year sojourn as a successful painter of London society. He intended to produce a series of paintings of fashionable Parisian women, but in 1885, in the church of St Sulpice, he had a vision of Jesus tending to people in a ruined building.

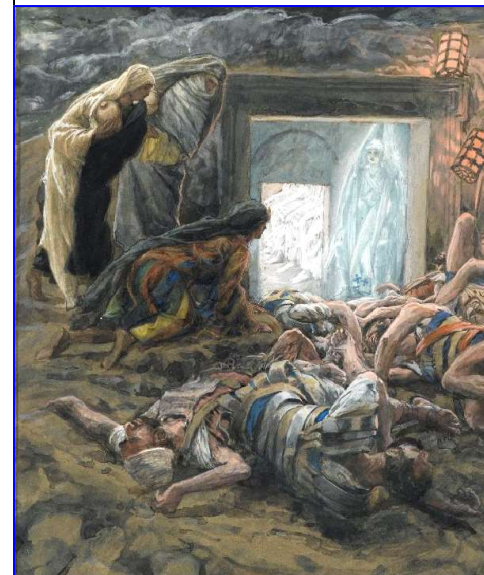
It was his Road to Damascus. He devoted the rest of his life to producing paintings about biblical events. This picture is part of his great series *The Life of Jesus Christ*.

To prepare for this artistic effort Tissot travelled to the Middle East in 1886, 1889, and 1896 to make studies of the landscapes and cultures. This would come to distinguish his work from

contemporary Biblical art through its striving for accuracy rather than religious emotion.

His series of 365 gouache illustrations of the life of Christ was shown to critical acclaim and enthusiastic audiences in Paris (1894-1895), London (1896) and New York (1898-1899).

In 1900 the entire series was bought by the Brooklyn Museum, New York.

James Tissot

A BOOK FOR LENT

Every year, hundreds of millions of Catholic and Protestant Christians around the world celebrate Lent. For the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday, observers devote themselves to fasting, prayer, study and acts of generous giving.

Lots of people who might not be observant, also give something up. In 2023, Country Living listed 32 ideas for what you might curtail, from "commenting on social media", "road rage" and "ignoring your health" to "speeding", "snacking" and "single-use plastic".

Archbishop Justin Welby has chosen a new book by British theologian Selina Stone as his annual recommendation for study in Lent. Entitled 'Tarry Awhile: Wisdom from Black Spirituality for People of Faith', this selection speaks to the growing salience of Black spirituality globally, especially in regards to Christianity.

The Archbishop's Lenten book choice cordially redirects religious literary attention to the influence of Black spirituality in Anglican thought.

A most intriguing aspect of this selection is what, for many, will be an infrequently used word in the title. "To tarry" is to linger in anticipation. In a Christian context, it is about waiting on God expectantly.

"Tarrying gives us an opportunity to rest," Welby writes in his foreword, "to see the realities of the world more clearly and to imagine more boldly what the world could be".

Stone, in her introduction, says the practice recognises "the interdependence of the individual and the community for encounter with God". She exhorts her readers – whether tarrying, as a tradition, feels like home to them or is entirely new – to be open, as they wait for the justice and peace so sorely missing from the world.

The Bible uses the word "tarry" at least 30 times. In particular, as Stone highlights, it is the word (in the King James Version) the Gospel of Matthew uses, when Jesus is in the garden of Gethsemane with his disciples. Overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death, he asks his disciples to, "tarry here and watch with me".

In a world where people are often encouraged to forsake relationship for productivity, perhaps all of us would do well to partake in a little more tarrying in our everyday lives.

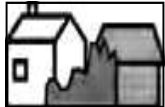

Four friends are gearing up for a day of thrills when they take on the world's fastest zip line in aid of Willow Wood Hospice.

Sue Lord, Julie Trickey, Nanette Backhouse and Alison Gough will rise to the challenge of speeding up to 100mph over Penrhyn Quarry in

picturesque north Wales.

Sue, Julie and Nanette are members of the Willow Wood Hospice Choir, which sings every Tuesday evening at the Hospice and holds fundraising events throughout the year.

The ladies are in their 40s, 50s and 70s respectively and all live in and around the Tameside area.

"Julie has done an abseil from IKEA and danced at one of the Strictly events for the hospice," Sue explained.

"Nanette has volunteered in the gardens, and the zip line has been on Alison's bucket list so she was keen to get involved too.

"We just want to raise as much money as possible for Willow Wood whilst having lots of fun. We are really looking forward to it."

One man's journey from Land's End to John O'Groats

The story of his journey is taken from his own account, which he wrote at the end of each day.

As you read it you get a sense that you are walking alongside him; seeing the things he saw and meeting the characters he met.

His style of writing is informative and enjoyable and his story is told with humour and humility of spirit.

Tom Beaver lived in Mottram for over 63 years.

Many of you will have known him.

His wife Mildred worked at Mottram C of E school and they brought up their two daughters Susan and Julie in Mottram.

Sadly, Tom passed away in October 2021.

In 1991 following the death of his beloved wife Mildred, to try and cope with his grief and to raise money for Francis House Children's Hospice, Tom walked on his own from Land's End to John O'Groats.

After each day's walk he wrote an account of his adventures and encounters.

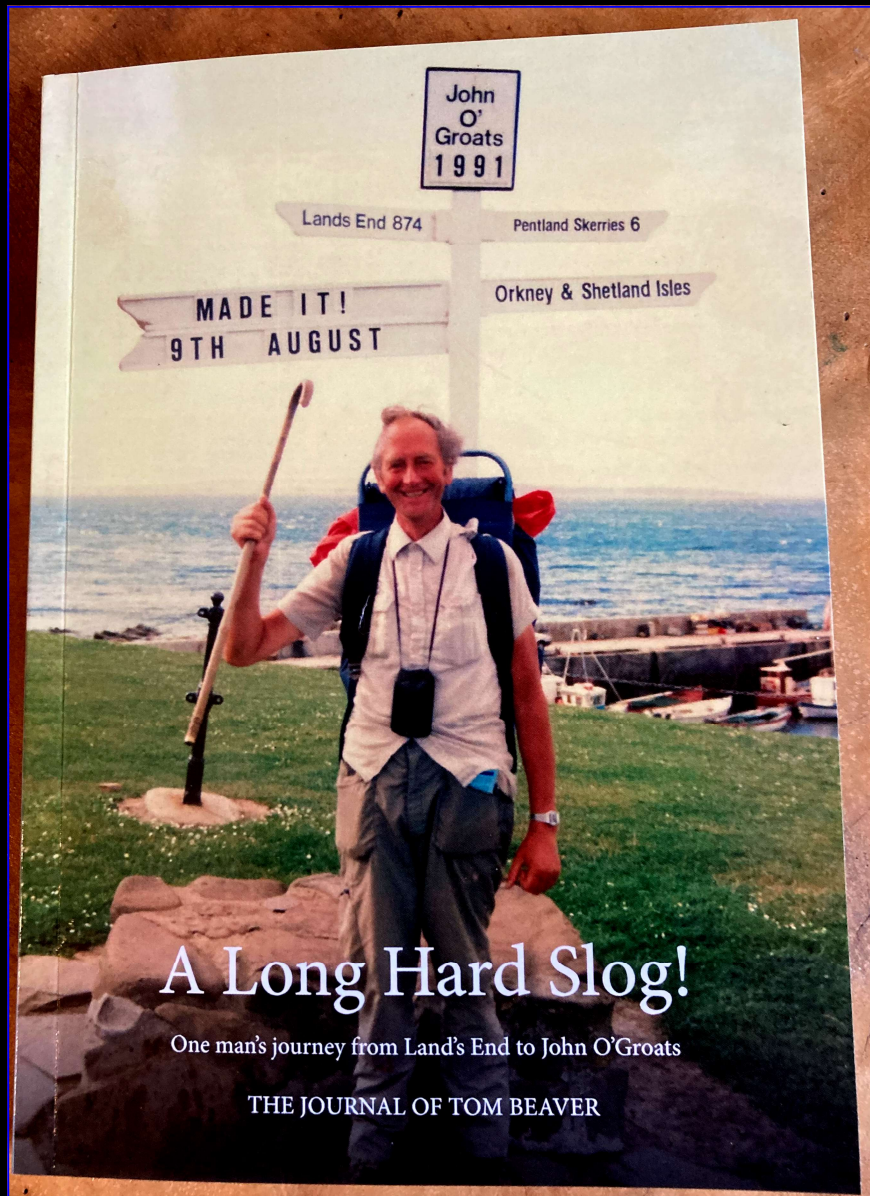
