

The Bells of Mottram

The bell ringers of Mottram Parish Church are raising money to repair the bell frame of Mottram's historic ring of eight bells.

The frame is under great tension due to corrosion in the metal foundation beams. This has also caused bolts to shear. In 2017 the situation was critical and it seemed the bells would fall silent. Blyth & Co. Ltd. The Church Bell Specialists, were able to offer us a solution to keep the bells ringing until further funds could be raised. They installed fully galvanised transverse beams to underpin the weakened girders. We received a grant from The Chester Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers to help with the work.

A substantial legacy from Rev. Dr. Richard L. Hills MBE now means the work can start to go forward and fully galvanised main beams can be installed. We have been promised a further grant from Chester Guild and there have been generous donations from individual bell ringers and others. Now, by arranging this concert along with other fundraising events, we hope to raise enough so that the work can start in the Spring. Once completed the frame should be fit to last for at least another 100 years.

Bell ringing is enjoyed by all ages and it's a very good way to make new friends. Once you are able to ring a bell you will be welcome in thousands of churches all over the country. Our team is involved in ringing all over the Diocese and further afield.

We ring for Sunday services, weddings and other special occasions. On Remembrance Sunday the bells are always rung half-muffled, and the Police Guild of Bell Ringers rang a peal here in memory of PCs Fiona Bone and Nicola Hughes.

When the frame is replaced we will train new ringers to carry on this traditional art and skill, almost unique to the British Isles.

Foodbank has grown a lot in the last couple of years. There is a new distribution centre in Hyde. The Trussell Trust have given us a grant to employ someone for 21 hours per week for two years to help run the foodbank. They will report to the Trustees and will do most of the everyday running of the foodbank.

General Synod Presidential Address by the Archbishop of York

Here is an edited version of Stephen Cottrell's recent speech...

Following Jesus isn't easy.

In the public square our words will often be misunderstood, misinterpreted and misquoted. People will think we're woke, naïve, misguided, too left wing, too right wing, too liberal or too conservative. We will be applauded for taking a moral stand, and pilloried for getting involved in politics. At the same time. On the same issue. But, knowing that we will sometimes get it wrong, what we try to be, is faithful to Jesus.

In personal witness we will sometimes meet scorn, apathy, even hostility. That which means most to us will be considered trivial and laughable by some. But when we do share the gospel, we will find ourselves standing on the holy ground of other people's stories - and their pain - and often we won't have the words to say, such as when we minister to those whose lives are cut short, or when taking the funeral of a child.

Our hearts will be pierced, and like Mary standing at the foot of the cross, our witness will be a silent vigil and a determination to abide.

We will carry a towel, not a flag. We will issue an invitation, not a summons. We will, wherever possible, roll away stones.

In overseeing and resourcing the church for ministry, a responsibility that we all share, we will have to make painful and difficult decisions. In facing up to mistakes, we will be humbled, especially by our failings to safeguard the Church or to root out racism or even just to communicate well, and show kindness to each other.

Yet the sight of the Most High gladdens and sustains us. For me, that is around the table of the Lord and in the daily slog and diet of prayer and the comfort of scripture.

And for all of us, laity, priests and bishops, the whole people of God, we must, as the first call upon our lives, pay attention to those sources of replenishing grace that are given us in word and worship, in sacrament and fellowship, enabling us to persevere, to get better, to make amends, to love one another.

So this is what I say to myself each day: Stephen, know your need of God; know that you need resources outside yourself; don't believe your own publicity; own up to your mistakes; don't think you're in charge or this is your church. It isn't. Seek out those places of prayerful contemplation and replenishing where you will know God's love for you.




