

### The poppies of Remembrance

In late 1914, WW1 erupted across Northern France and Flanders. Great swathes of previously green fields and forests were blasted and bombed,



leaving them bleak and barren, with seemingly every living thing destroyed.

Then in Spring 1915, something beautiful began to come out of the destruction. Tens of thousands of bright red Flanders poppies began to appear across the endless vistas of mud. These resilient little flowers had flourished in the middle of so much chaos and destruction, because their seeds grow when exposed to sunlight, through disturbance to soil.

We all know that these endless fields of cheerful poppies, growing in the midst of such misery and destruction, were what inspired the Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, to write the now famous poem 'In Flanders Fields'.

It was McCrae's poem which inspired American academic Moina Michael to adopt the poppy in memory of those who had fallen in the war. She got it adopted as an official symbol of Remembrance across the United States, and worked with others who were doing the same in Canada, Australia, and the UK.

A French woman, Anna Guérin who was in the UK in 1921, caught the same vision, and planned to sell the poppies in London. There she met Earl Haig, the founder of the Royal British Legion, who was persuaded to adopt the poppy as its emblem in the UK.

The Royal British Legion ordered nine million poppies and sold them on 11 November that year. Since then, the red poppy has been a symbol of Remembrance, of support for the Armed Forces community, and of hope for a future of peace.

### Cursillo by Kath Higgins

Betty, Sue and I have just been on a special Cursillo (pronounced kur-see-o) weekend. This has prompted me to try and promote Cursillo in our Church.

For those who don't know about Cursillo, it is run under the British Anglican Cursillo Council. It is a lay led Christian movement of like-minded people who are wanting to develop their faith.

Cursillo originated in Spain and the name Cursillo means short course. The weekend is usually 3 days, (although a 2 day weekend is being considered for those who work and can't get a Friday off) Thursday to Sunday, and consists of 15 short talks, 5 meditations and the Eucharist each day and is held at either Wistaston Hall, Crewe, or Foxhill, Frodsham.

After the actual weekend there are follow ups, that consist of Group Reunions where three or four people meet up to discuss their faith. These are held regularly on a monthly basis or whenever the groups choose. Chester Diocese hold two or three get-togethers, which are known as Ultreyas. These are held at different Churches in the Diocese and all Cursillistas are invited to attend. The Ultreyas, another Spanish word which means onwards and upwards, are usually from 10am to 4pm and include a bring and share lunch and finish with the Eucharist.

If anyone is interested to know more about this movement, please have a word with one of us, or alternatively join us at a Group Reunion. We will be delighted to tell you when our next one is.

There are leaflets and information at the back of Church to tell you about Cursillo, or google Chester Diocese and you will find lots of information about us.

Research by Coventry University, in partnership with charity 'Restored,' studying the C of E, reveals that 42.2% of churchgoers admit experiencing at least one abusive act in a previous relationship, with 1 in 4 experiencing an act of abuse within their current relationship. However, only 2 in 7 churchgoers consider their church adequately equipped to deal with disclosure of domestic abuse.

In response to the research, Press Red, who exist to raise awareness of violence against women, commissioned 'Control,' a theatre piece designed to help the church recognise warning signs, consider biases and assumptions, and provide signposting for professional support.

This live theatre experience demonstrates the collapse of a relationship in the face of one man's controlling behaviour, misogynistic beliefs and abusive tactics. The performance provides a challenging insight into the cycle of abuse employed in a Christian marriage exploring the attitudes, beliefs and culture which support the behaviours.

It has been delivered to New Scotland Yard, the Home Office, Tearfund and other gender justice forums and conferences, community groups and churches. Audiences have included police officers, lawyers, survivors, perpetrators, artists, politicians, church leaders, congregations and the wider general public.

This newly revised version, recently premiering at a Manchester University and Cliff College colloquium, has an additional focus on spiritual abuse, exploring how misuse of scripture can help create a culture where coercive control can exist.

Actor and writer Matt Britton, has over 25 years of theatre industry experience, including previously working as an applied dramatist practitioner with perpetrators of domestic violence in probation group settings.

Actor Emily Lawson has worked professionally in theatre for over 15 years, from fringe theatre and independent films to musicals.


