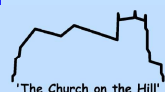

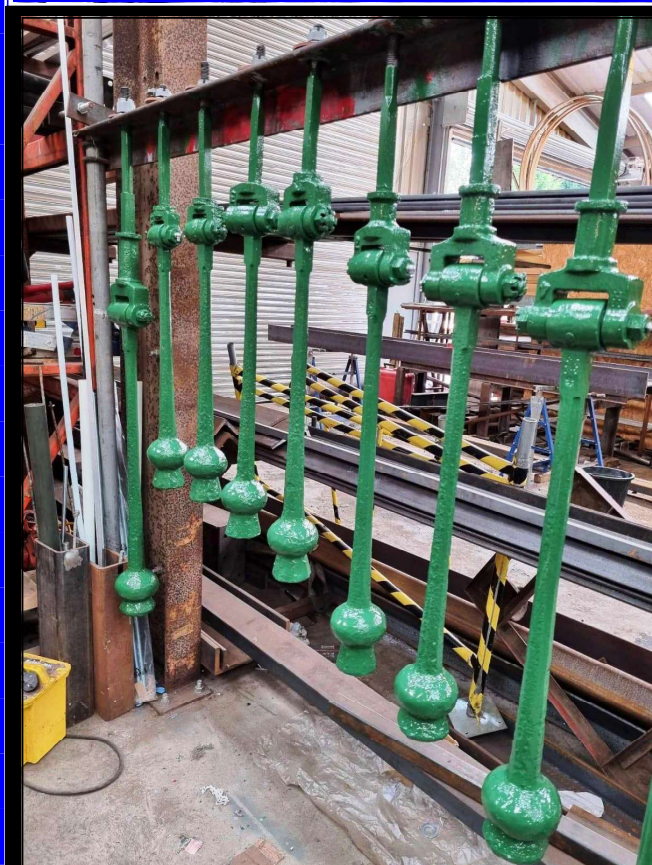

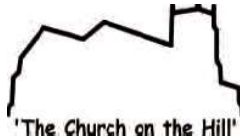

Climate Change and the C of E

The Church Commissioners and Church of England Pensions Board have recently each announced they will independently disinvest from fossil fuels this year.

The announcement came as the Church of England's National Investing Bodies (NIBs) reported back to the General Synod on progress against a 2018 Synod motion, which set out a five-year strategy to invest in climate solutions, engage with high carbon emitting companies, and disinvest from fossil fuel companies not aligned with the Paris Agreement.

In 2021, the Church Commissioners excluded 20 oil and gas majors from its investment portfolio. It is now also excluding BP, Ecopetrol, Eni, Equinor, ExxonMobil, Occidental Petroleum, Pemex, Repsol, Sasol, Shell, and Total, after concluding that none are aligned with the goals of the Paris Climate Agreement.

The Most Revd Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury and Chair of the Church Commissioners for England, said: "We have long urged companies to take climate change seriously, to align with the goals of the Paris Climate Agreement and to pursue efforts to limit the rise in temperature to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels. In practical terms that means phasing out fossil fuels, investing in renewables, and plotting a credible path to a net zero world.

Some progress has been made, but not nearly enough. The Church will follow not just the science, but our faith – both of which call us to work for climate justice."

Climate Change and St Michael's

- *What is the project?*

Design and installation of a new heating system to replace the obsolete, inefficient and ineffective 1980s system which had failed.

- *What does the project aim to achieve?*

To provide a warm, welcoming environment; protect and preserve the fabric of our grade II* listed building; make the building more useful to the local community; and to do that using the lowest carbon footprint as possible.

- *How much are we looking for from a grant?*

The project is likely to cost £100,000 in the first phase (installation of the heating system), with a further £20,000+ in the second phase (installation of solar panels). We are hoping for £20,000 to contribute to the funding already provided by a generous bequest.

- *Do we have a start date and is the project ongoing or is there an envisaged completion date?*

The process of design and approval (through the church planning system) is ongoing. We hope to have the system installed before the coming winter - in October or November this year. Plans are displayed in church.

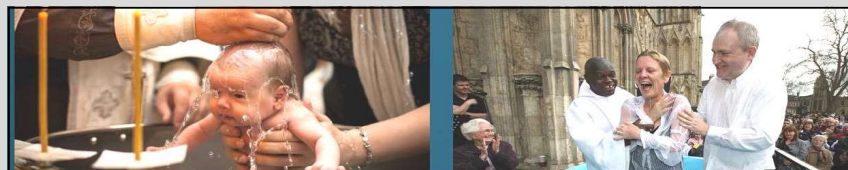

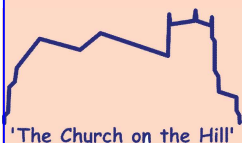

Church News - (1)

According to the mental health charity Mind, each week in England, six out of every hundred people will be diagnosed with generalised anxiety disorder. (Mind)

In the UK, over eight million people are experiencing an anxiety disorder at any one time (Mental Health UK).

Less than 50% of people with generalised anxiety disorder access treatment (Mental Health Foundation)

5219 suicides were registered in 2021.
This is 307 more than in 2020.

77% of men polled have suffered with common mental health symptoms like anxiety, stress or depression.
40% of men have never spoken to anyone about their mental health.

Not being able to access the right care and support when it is needed increases the risk of individuals' mental health deteriorating. This is a long-standing challenge, which has been exacerbated by the increased demand on mental health services due to COVID-19.

In March Maggie Flint and Louise Britton completed two full days of training to become Mental Health First Aiders.

Neither are therapists or psychiatrists but can offer initial support through non judgmental listening and guidance.

If you are struggling or need advice for a loved one in crisis, please do not hesitate to reach out to our Parish Mental Health First Aiders.

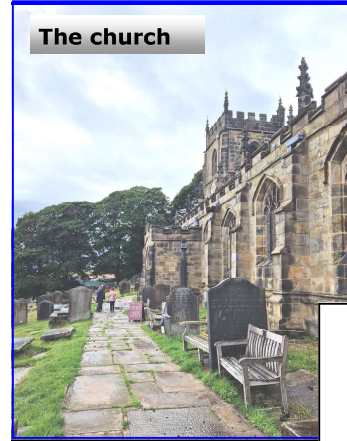

"Well worth a visit"

St Nicholas Church, High Bradfield

I visited this church the other day with friends. It's a beautiful 15th Century building, Grade 1 listed, in the small village of High Bradfield which is located 6 miles north west of the centre of Sheffield. It is 260 metres (850 feet) above sea level and overlooks the Peak District National Park. Unusually for these days it was open and there is an excellent pub just along the road called the "Old Horns".

As you can see from the photos, they have a very unusual way of keeping the churchyard grass cut, but beware of the droppings! Although I am not too sure of the notice on the back of the door "to stop the sheep coming into church" - I am sure they meant the woolly, four footed kind - but you never know!

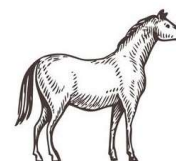

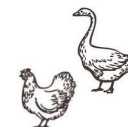

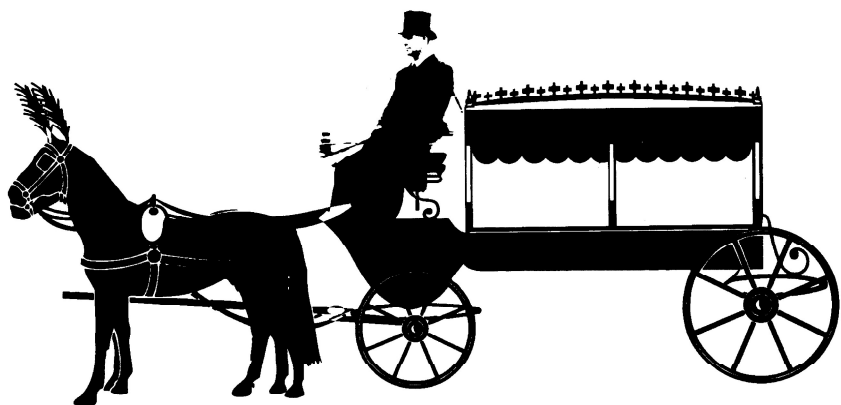
