



Over 90% of the food distributed by foodbanks in The Trussell Trust network is donated by the public – that's why your food donations are absolutely vital to our ability to give everyone referred to us a balanced and nutritious three day supply of food.

Our foodbank relies on your goodwill and support.

At the moment our stores are very patchy - we have more than enough of some items, but not enough of others.

Please check the list below to see what we are short of at the moment.

We provide parcels of food for 3 days – so mega bags e.g. 3kg pasta or rice are difficult – 500g or 1kg bags are better.

UHT Milk, Tinned fish, Tinned fruit, Pasta Sauce, Long-life puddings e.g. steamed puddings or long-life cake, Long-life fruit juice or squash.

FOOD BANK NOTICE (CONTINUED)

If you need help from our foodbank there are a few simple steps to follow.

The most important step is to get a foodbank voucher.

In order to provide the most appropriate help for the circumstances of your situation we work with local agencies. If they feel you are struggling to put food on the table, they will issue you with a foodbank voucher. The local agency can also provide long term support if needed to help address some of the issues behind the reasons for your crisis. Agencies we work with include: Citizens Advice, housing support officers, children's centres, health visitors, social services and some local charities.

You can talk confidentially with a trained Citizen's Advice adviser who can help address your crisis and provide support to maximise your income, help you navigate the benefits system, and identify any additional grants you could be entitled to. If needed, they'll issue you with a voucher so you can get an emergency food parcel from your local food bank.

Bring your foodbank voucher to your nearest foodbank centre.

If you have any dietary needs (for example religious or health needs) please let us know then we can make up a parcel specially for you. We will provide you with a food parcel of three days of emergency food.

Foodbank clients who have a fuel crisis may also be able to get advice and support from their foodbank.




Lynne was presented with a gift towards the replacement of a Greek bracelet, of great sentimental value, a present from her husband Mick, which had unfortunately been lost.

WORTH A VISIT

At the end of August several members of the Friends of Mottram Church committee paid a visit to St Margaret's Church, Altrincham.

We attended the Wednesday Eucharist at the invitation of the vicar, Rev David Murray and enjoyed meeting him and members of his congregation over tea/coffee and biscuits after the service.

The grade II listed church was built between 1851 and '54 by George Grey, 7th Earl of Stamford, and dedicated to his sister Margaret who died in 1852.

At the time it was in the middle of nowhere and there are various speculations as to why it was built where it was. One theory is one

of the Earls wives was ostracised by the parish church as she had been a bare-back rider in the circus. Another is that the railway had been extended to Bowden and Manchester mill owners wanted to escape the smoke of their factories.

But we were there to see 'Tommy'. This magnificent, imposing statue was spotted by Catherine Rogerson when she gave a talk to their ladies group. We just had to see him for ourselves!

'Tommy' is carved, in one piece, from a beech tree which had come down in a storm some years previously in the church grounds. A local sculptor asked to have the tree and later returned with this amazing work of art.



'Tommy' takes pride of place during their Remembrance service. This statue is a joy to behold and very tactile.

After an enjoyable morning, when we received a very warm welcome, we lunched at nearby Dunham Barn.


Brenda's jam jars have brought in an excellent £1,730 so far. The aim is to reach £2000 by Christmas.
